General Information

The Ethan Winter Memorial Scholarship annually awards two \$500 scholarships to one boy and one girl soccer player who attend Emery High School AND two \$500 scholarships to one boy and one girl soccer player who attend Carbon High School . The goal of the scholarships is to provide financial aid to students who have demonstrated commitment and dedication to soccer, exceptional sportsmanship, strong academics, community involvement, and a desire to further their education.

The scholarship money can only be used for tuition, school fees, and books. The check will be made out to the school, but mailed to the scholarship winner.

Eligibility Requirements

- Must be a senior at Emery or Carbon High School who played on the boys' or girls' soccer team.
- Must be a citizen or a legal resident of the United States.
- Must have a grade point average of 3.0 or higher.
- Cannot be a relative of anyone on the board.

Application Requirements

- Must fully complete the provided application form.
- Must include a written essay about how being involved in soccer has impacted your life and how
 you may be similar to and/or different than Ethan. (Use the information provided) The essay
 should be no more than 500 words.
- Must provide two letters of recommendation one personal and one school. Cannot be a
 member of Ethan's family or any person on the board. Include a phone number and email
 address of the person recommending.
- Must include a copy of your transcript.
- Must be able to provide an acceptance letter or class schedule from a two or four year postsecondary school, college, university, trade or technical school, if selected as one of the winners.
- Application must be submitted by April 12, 2020.
