

# National College and Career Readiness Indicators

*Indicators associated with post-secondary success*

## College Ready Indicators

Students are considered to be **college** ready if they have a GPA of 2.8 out of a 4.0 **and** meet **one or more** of the following benchmarks:

- Advance Placement (AP) exam, scored 3 or higher
- Advanced Placement (AP) course, grade A or B
- Concurrent enrollment in English 1010 or Math 1050, grade A or B
- Math III, grade A or B
- **NO** grade lower than a C
- ACT scores at or above:
  - 18 English
  - 22 Reading
  - 23 Science
  - 23 Math

*Other indicators that should be considered as a whole with the above are:*

- FAFSA completion
- Enrollment in a career pathway course sequence
- Participated in CCR academic advising
- Applied for **at least** two scholarships
- Taking math during senior year
- Completion of a math class after Math III

## Career Ready Indicators

Students are considered **career** ready if they have identified a career interest area and met **two or more** of the following benchmarks:

- 90% school attendance (162/180 days)
- 25 hours of community service
- Workplace learning experience
- Earned an industry credential
- Concurrent enrollment career pathway course
- Involved in **two or more** organized extra-curricular activities

In addition, students hoping to enter the military must meet the passing scores on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) for each branch of the military **and earn a high school diploma.**
